


The biggest feedback the Homemakers received from last year's Bazaar is the need for vendors to have more table space. This year, vendors can request additional tables for \$15 per table. Vendors who setup will be provided with one table (72x30 inches) and two chairs by default. Vendors are asked not to bring additional tables, racks, or other equipment that will block other vendors, doors, or exits. To note, the more vendors who request additional tables the less vendors

for non-members to setup, which will be \$30. Alternatively, non-members can join Homemakers

for \$12 + \$15 setup fee for \$27 total. Joining homemakers will save vendors \$3 and is encouraged.

To accommodate more vendors and tables this year, we will also be utilizing our smaller community room. This room is down the hall, but signage will be provided to encourage customers to visit the community room. The last five vendors to sign up will be placed in the community





The Bazaar Committee would like to kindly ask our homemaker clubs to bake extra cakes, pies, etc this year. Baked items are always popular leading into the holidays. Mailbox club members who would like to donate to the coffee bar individual pastries to sell along side the coffee would be appreciated. 










# HOMENAMER

# 2024 Vendor Rules

#### What, When, Where

The Holiday Bazaar is a local craft market organized by the Adair County Extension Homemakers. Money generated from the Bazaar supports scholarships and educational programs of the Homemakers. The Bazaar will take place on Saturday, November 23rd from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm CST at the Adair County Extension Office.

Register

Registration for the Bazaar is due by November 18th at 4:30 pm CST. To register, return this signed vendor sheet to the Extension Office. The office is located at 409 Fairground Street, Columbia KY 42728. Anyone may be a Bazaar vendor, including non-homemaker members. Cost is explained more in the next section. Registered participants will be notified of any changes.

#### Cost

This year there are two cost options for vendors to setup at the Bazaar.

- Option #1 Join Homemakers To join Homemakers costs \$12 and you receive the full benefits of homemaker membership. Then additionally, to setup at the Bazaar will cost \$15. This is a total cost of \$27, \$12 membership + \$15 setup fee = \$27 total. Already paid 2024 members do not need to rejoin.
- Option #2 Setup as a Non-Member Setup at the Bazaar for \$30 without joining homemakers.
- Additional tables will cost \$15 per table. Please notify the office at the time of payment if you would like extra tables.

**Types of Vendors** 

The bazaar is intended for vendors who are profit seeking. However, non-profit vendors will be allowed on a case by case basis. Please speak to Dylan Gentry or Donna Jones for more information.

#### **Items Not Allowed**

The Bazaar is limited to handmade/locally sourced items only. Re-sell items are not allowed. The bazaar is a family friendly event. Yard sale items, junk, obscene material, illegal items, etc are not allowed.

Setup

Setup for the Bazaar will begin at 4:00 pm on Friday, November 22nd and conclude at 6:30 pm. Setup will then resume the day of the Holiday Bazaar beginning at 8:00 am on November 23rd and conclude at 10:00 am.

Vendors will be supplied a table and two chairs, the measurements of the rectangular table is 72x30 inches. Vendors may purchase an additional table for \$15 per table. Vendors are asked not to setup their booths in a way that will block other vendors, walkways, or exits.

**Electricity** 

Electricity for vendors will be very scarce, but a limited number of outlets will be available based on table assignments. Accessories powered by batteries are the safest bets. Unsafe use of electricity, such as plugging multiple extension cords into one, overloading the outlet, frayed or exposed electrical wires, and tripping hazards are not allowed.

#### Wifi

Wifi is available for vendors. However, there are no assurances that wifi is secure. Caution should be exercised when executing credit card payments.

#### **Takedown**

You may begin packing up your table at 4:00 pm on Bazaar day. If the crowd begins to dwindle at an earlier time, you may pack up earlier.

#### **Door Prizes**

Vendors are no longer required to provide door prizes. Instead, the Homemakers will sponsor 10, \$5 gift cards to be used exclusively at the Bazaar. Customers can redeem these gift cards at the coffee bar or participating vendor booths. Vendors can then turn in the gift cards to the Homemakers for reimbursement. These gift cards will be given away throughout the day and are valid only at the Bazaar.

## **Butternut Squash and Turkey Chili**

- 2 tablespoons olive oil1 medium onion,chopped
- 4 cloves garlic, minced1 pound groundturkey
- 1 pound (1 small) butternut squash — peeled, seeded, and cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1 cup low-sodium chicken broth1 (4.5-ounce) can choppedgreen chilies
- 2 (14.5-ounce) canspetite diced tomatoes1 (15-ounce) canno-salt-added kidney
- no-salt-added kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (15.5-ounce) can white hominy, drained1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
- 1 (8-ounce) can tomato saud 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin

1/2 teaspoon salt

**Stovetop:** Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Stir in the onion and garlic; cook and **stir** for 3 minutes or until onion is translucent. **Add** ground turkey. **Break** into pieces and **stir** until cooked through and no longer pink. **Add** the butternut squash, chicken broth, green chilies, tomatoes, kidney beans, hominy, and tomato sauce. Season with chili powder, cumin, and salt. **Bring** to a simmer, **reduce** heat to medium-low, and cover. **Simmer** until the squash is tender, about 20 minutes.

Electric Pressure Cooker: Press sauté function. **Add** olive oil and onion; **cook** and stir for 3 minutes or until onion is translucent. **Add** garlic and cook for 30 more seconds. **Add** ground turkey. Break into pieces and stir until cooked through and no longer pink. Add the butternut squash, chicken broth, green chilies, tomatoes, kidney beans, hominy, and tomato sauce. Season with chili powder, cumin, and salt. **Close** the lid, and then turn venting knob to the sealing position. Pressure **cook** at High Pressure for 15 minutes, allow for a natural release. Open the lid carefully.

**Yield:** 10, 1-cup servings
